

### MLA CITATION EXAMPLES FOR WORLD WIDE WEB SITES

The following are examples of works cited entries for information found on “web sites” via the World Wide Web. **Be sure to find out if your instructor has a preferred citation style.** A citation for a web site will generally include:

Author’s last name, first name. “Name of the Page.” Title of the Entire Web Site. Date of publication or last update.

Date of access <<http://www.websitename.com>>.

*Some of the above information may not be present on every web page. The savvy student will explore the web site to find as much of this information as possible.*
